Thank you to everyone who submitted information this year – it really helps us to communicate the good work we are doing to a wide range of stakeholders, including you!

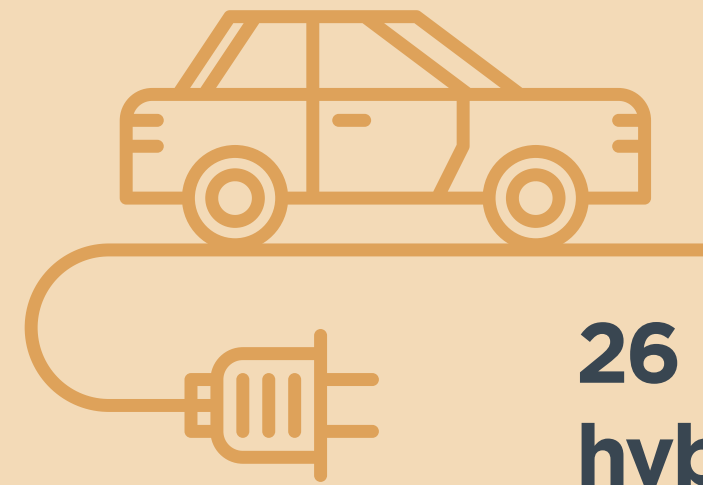
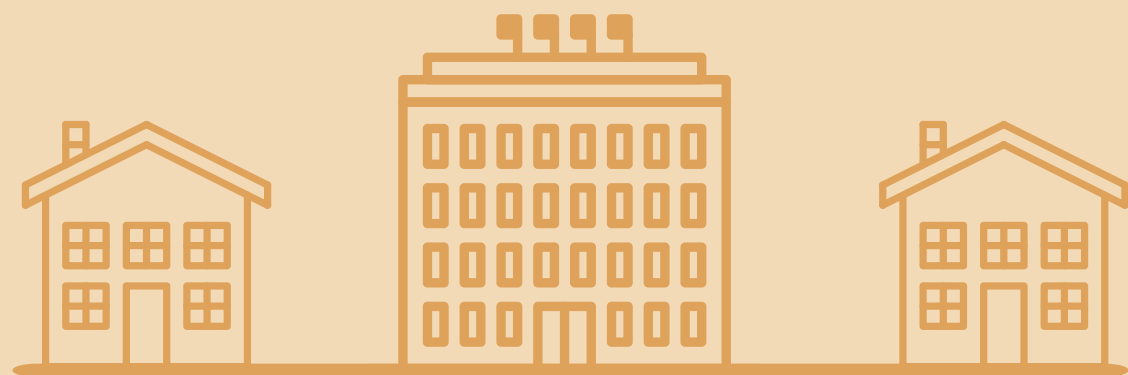
Our people at Peel L&P:

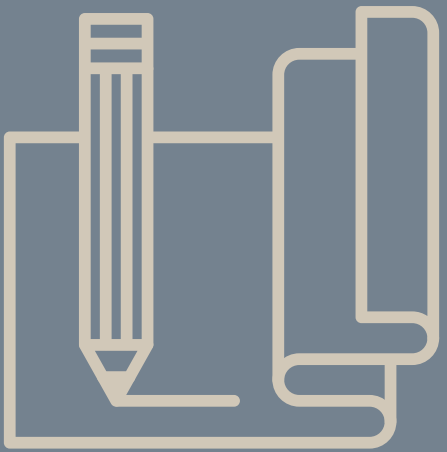

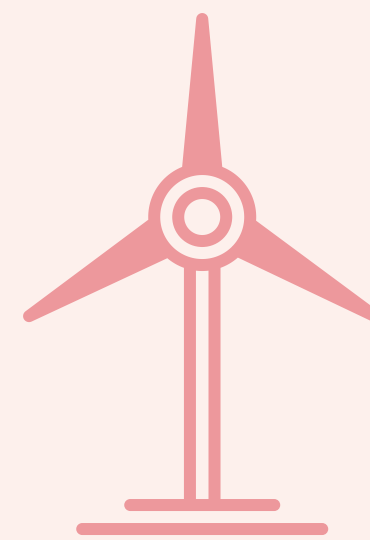

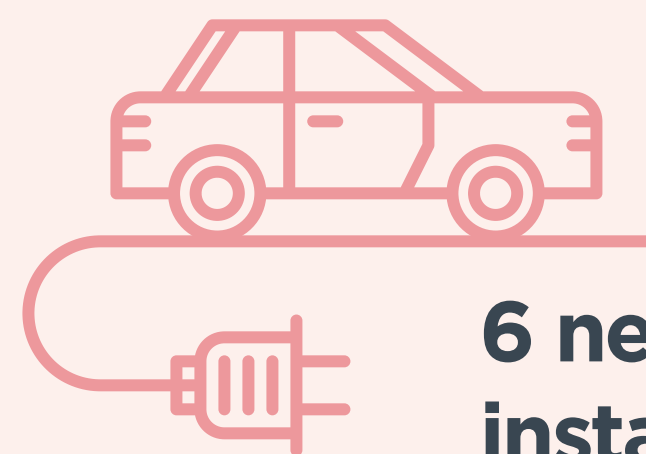

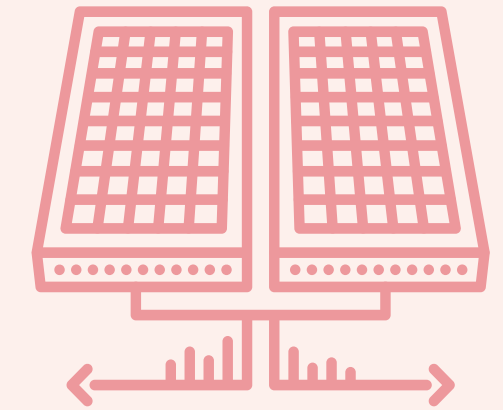

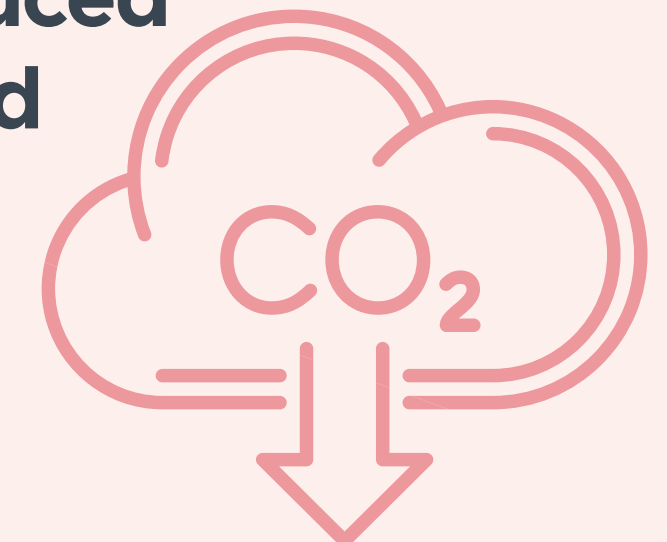

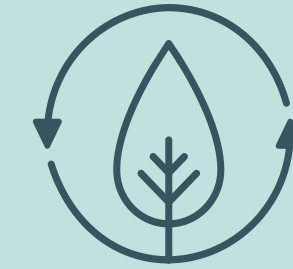

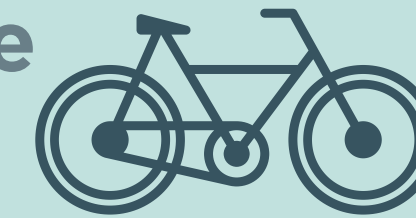

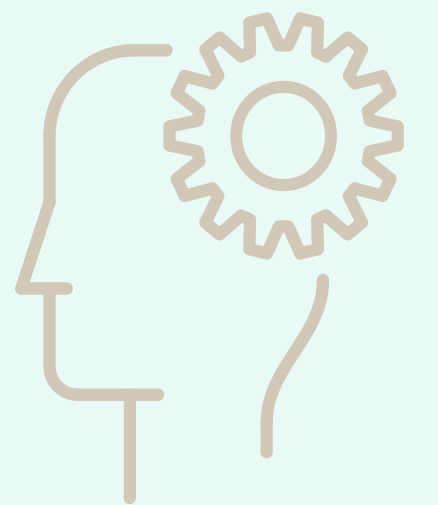


Public engagement
